Skill development training of the child

The best education does not happen at a desk but rather engaged in everyday living- hands-on, exploring, in an active relationship with life- Vince Gowmon

Skill development is probably the easiest part of the exercise. The challenge lies in identifying the skills of the child. A teacher or a parent cannot, on their own in many cases, identify the skills of a child. Both the teacher(s) and the parent(s) have to pay attention to the child and

suddenly it will only be a shocker to all that the child has many skills and not just one. A Parent-teacher meeting should never be just about academics or sports alone. Instead, the focus needs to be about identifying the interests and skills of the child. Once this part is done, the child is encouraged to hone his/her skills and one can notice a marked improvement in the confidence of the child. This confidence is then manifested when the child improves in aspects of skills in which the child is actually weak. Skill development in any aspect should be discussed with the child and encouraged. This helps the child to internalize their skills and allow them to apply them in other aspects of life – sports, arts, academics, and life skills. A child interested in Math needs to be encouraged to apply the same in Arts and Sports through understanding geometry, algebra and etc. A child interested in Music can be encouraged to apply the same in physics – for example, in understanding sound, frequency, time, etc. Complimentary activities to their learning will help the child in holistic development. Developing a particular skill is as important as applying the skill to other aspects of academics and more importantly life – thus making a complete and successful person.

CHILDHOOD SPAN

It is human to have a long childhood; it is civilized to have an even longer childhood. -Erikson

From some theories on children, we will explore the five stages of them, that infants, children, and teenagers have to pass through. However, the remaining four stages of adulthood and older age are also worthy, according to Lifespan Theory, psychosocial development and well-being of adult is key to ensuring the same for children.

The key psycho-social developmental challenge for an infant is that relating to trust and mistrust.

The second stage centres on later infancy/early childhood, i.e. about 18months to 2-3 years. The key psychosocial challenges of this age relate to autonomy and shame/doubt.

The third stage extends from early childhood, about 3 years, up to formal school-age of about 5 years. Motor and cognitive skills continue to develop and imagination starts to be expressed, usually in play and drawings, most obviously. In general, the child's active curiosity and wish for exploration of the world is evident. And this stage involves initiative versus guilt.

The fourth stage covers from about 6 to 11 years of age, the primary or elementary stage of schooling. This is a time when the skills of literacy and numeracy are acquired, and the child mixes more and more with people outside the home, learning about their society and the culture in which they live. Achievement and increasing levels of self-control are hallmarks of this time and the major challenges as identity versus inferiority.

The Fifth and Final stage is that of adolescence, typically a complicated time for most young people and their families. This lasts between 8 and 10years, starting at about 10 to 11 years of age and lasting until early adulthood. Marked

physical growth, sexual development, and the push for independence, choice, and privacy increases. The main themes of psychosocial development are Identity versus Identity confusion. Young people of this age have to discover who they are, what they want to do and be, and where they fit in the world. It's probably true to say that many people get stuck at this stage for some time – and not unusually, well beyond the early 20s. Ideally, the young person will be supported in exploring different options, given increasing freedom of choice and a strong, supportive family base.

Useful Tip: Your four-year-old has an imaginary friend with whom they play and talk, usually when they are on their

own. Psychologists have found that this is not an unusual occurrence and is actually a helpful and transitory phase of cognitive, social, and emotional development. It's important to accept the child's initiative in creating this playmate and in no way to make them feel ashamed or guilty or unusual. If the child refers to 'their friend', it's probably best to acknowledge and accept their 'playmate' but also to keep things real by letting them know that you know this is 'pretend' and part of their play.

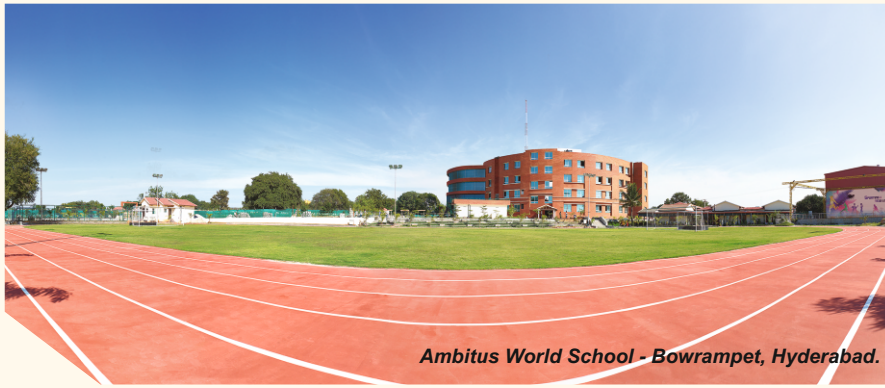
